


outdoor recreation



Some things in life just need to be experienced first hand to be appreciated. Driving around Las Vegas you've no doubt seen the mountain structure out at Red Rock that is shaped like a turtle at the top. For those that don't know, this is Turtle Head Peak.

This is pretty much a "must do" trek to tackle for all hikers. This hike starts at Sandstone Quarry, follows a wash northward for most of a mile, turns east to climb hillsides and a gully to the summit ridge, and then follows the summit ridge south to the peak. At only 5 miles, it is one of the shortest distance hikes but it is also fairly difficult due to the steepness and alot of scrambling around boulders to get to the top.

Sometimes the shortest distance to the top is not straight up, if there's a trail follow it. Trying to cut through to the top left me with scratches from random trees and bushes with alot of extra effort on my end.

Depending what time of year you go it can either get very hot or very cold on the way up. Redrock can get icy which has caused me to slip in the past. Always make sure you're footing is under you. Three miles from the top I decided to run it. When you reach the top it is very sweet when you get there so keep moving, don't quit halfway it's worth it. Now at the top is the time to take it all in. The view to the south overlooks Sandstone Quarry and most of the route to the summit. To the north lies the La Madre Range and the grand south face of La Madre peak. To the west lies the red and white sandstone of the Wilson Cliffs and their overly-

ing limestone ridges.Las Vegas lies to the southeast in all its glory. The distinction of The Strip is unmistakable from anywhere in the world. And right now on Turtle Head Peak you are on top of the world. The city, the world, and your troubles are miles away so breath it all in before heading back down. Take your time up there, you've earned it. This trail is not just a simple stroll, it takes some effort and some doing but it is a great deal of fun.

At the very top of the peak is a sign-in book inside an old ammo can. It's a distinct pleasure and privelage to add your name to those who came before you and say you made it to the top, you're the king of the world, Yo Adrian, you did it!

The easiest way down is to retrace your steps, stay close on the ridgeline on the

summit slopes and to the middle through the gully. It's very steep and somehow going down was harder than climbing up due to the pressure on the knees. Plan your trip wisely. If it's a long way up it's a long way back down. The ambitious can make it in and out in a little over 2 hrs. There are great views fo the Las Vegas Valley all the way up so take your time to enjoy the scenery around you. The particular day that I tackled Turtle Head I distinctly remember the sun just setting as I made my way back down the hill. It was a sweet sight and that I had to pause to take in. I felt like I was staring at Heaven and if I listened closely enough I could hear the voice of God talking to me...no lie.
